

St Georges Cricket Club Disciplinary Procedure

1. The General Committee shall delegate responsibility for Disciplinary matters to a Sub-Committee to be known as the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.
2. The Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall consist of 3 members of the main Cricket Committee (excluding the Chairman – see 8. below) and be agreed by the Cricket Committee on an Annual basis and/or as required.
3. The Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall have delegated powers to instruct Captains not to select a player whilst an investigation is taking place (depending on the severity of the incident) without prejudicing the outcome of the investigation.
4. The Disciplinary Sub-Committee will inform the individual as soon as is reasonably practical of the detail of the disciplinary matters to be investigated, and the process to be followed.
5. Following an investigation the Disciplinary Sub-Committee will inform the individual of the allegations made against them and give them an opportunity to put their point of view to the Sub-Committee.
6. The Disciplinary Sub-Committee will make a decision about any disciplinary action and enforce the outcome. They will inform the individual of the outcome and relevant Captains. They will also report the outcome of any disciplinary matters to the next full Cricket Committee meeting.
7. Where disciplinary action is taken against the individual by an outside body (e.g. the League) the Disciplinary Sub-Committee will need to abide by the decisions taken by that body before taking any further action on behalf of the Cricket Club
8. The individual will have the right of appeal to the full Cricket Committee about any decision taken by the Disciplinary Sub-Committee. Any such appeal should be made in writing to the Chairman of the Cricket Committee within 28 days of being informed of disciplinary action, who will arrange for a Sub-Committee (to include no members of the Disciplinary Committee which dealt with the matter originally) to consider the appeal.
9. The Decision of the Cricket Committee shall be final.
10. All Decisions will be put in writing to the individual and to the League (as appropriate)
11. Where the person facing disciplinary action is under 18 years of age, their parents must be informed and accompany their child to any hearing that is held. They will receive copies of all correspondence and be kept fully informed.
