



Would you like to be part of a Young Persons Committee made up of junior members and run by juniors?

This committee of juniors would be supported by 2 or 3 senior members but would be run by you.

You would elect your own Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.

The committee would meet regularly. How frequently would be down to the committee members to decide. It could be monthly or every 2 months for example.

The meetings would be held in the Committee Room (where we have cricket teas) on an evening and at a time to be agreed by the members of the committee.

The Committee could be any size but a good number of people would be 8 to 10 members.

What would the Committee do? We would want juniors to think about this too and set its own objectives, but you could for example:

- Discuss how you think the seniors are running the club and put forward your ideas
- Discuss and tell the Junior Committee what you think about the junior sessions – what is good, what could be improved, etc.
- Think about some fundraising events and perhaps take responsibility for arranging one event a year – how about a car washing event on the car park for e.g. What ideas have you got?
- Think about how juniors working together in a group supported by an adult could provide support at some events the Cricket Club put on – e.g. car parking duties when we hold large events

The Chairman of your committee would be able to go and talk to the main Cricket Committee and the Junior Committee and put forward your committee's ideas.

We think this could be a good opportunity for a group of you to take this idea forward. It should be enjoyable, provide you with good experience to learn about volunteering and look good on your CV. It could also help with some aspects of your school work.

How old would I need to be to become a committee member? There is not a right answer to this but we think that you should be in school year 9 or above and have your parents consent. We would also be interested to hear from you about what age you think a young person should leave the committee?
